The CBSE has introduced Holistic Progress Cards (HPC) as part of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, moving away from traditional knowledge-based assessments to competency-based evaluation. These cards provide a comprehensive view of a student's progress across cognitive, affective, socio-emotional, and psychomotor domains, as well as life skills and values. They incorporate self, peer, and teacher assessments, and aim to offer a 360-degree view of the learner's development.

Key Features of the Holistic Progress Card:

Multidimensional Assessment: HPCs assess students across various domains, including cognitive, affective, socio-emotional, and psychomotor skills, as well as life skills and values.

Competency-Based Learning: The HPC aligns with competency-based education, focusing on assessing the skills and knowledge acquired through learning, rather than rote memorization.

Comprehensive Evaluation: It provides a holistic picture of a student's progress, integrating self, peer, and teacher evaluations.

Emphasis on Higher-Order Skills: The HPC emphasizes the evaluation of higher-order skills like analysis, critical thinking, and conceptual clarity.

Inclusivity and Individualized Learning: HPCs are designed to cater to individual learning needs and pace, promoting a personalized learning experience.

Integration with NEP 2020: The HPC is a key initiative of NCERT's PARAKH, aligning with the broader goals of the NEP 2020.

Link between Home and School: HPCs are intended to foster better communication and collaboration between teachers and parents, involving them in the student's learning journey.

Digital Integration: The HPC is linked to DigiLocker, an online platform for digitizing documents, making it accessible and secure.

The HPC emphasizes ongoing feedback and support for students to improve their learning.

In essence, the Holistic Progress Card is a move towards a more student-centered and comprehensive approach to assessment, aligned with the principles of NEP 2020.
