A session was held for grade 12 students on 12th April, 2025. This session aimed at motivating and guiding students on striking a balance between their academics and other activities. The Principal emphasized the significance of their last year of school life, on it being instrumental in shaping their career. A similar session was also held with all the new admissions from classes 2 to 12. This was to formally welcome them and making them comfortable with the school environment & school culture.

### **Bridge Course for IGCSE & IB Junior Students**

A comprehensive bridge course was conducted to facilitate a smooth transition for incoming junior students into the IGCSE and IB curricula. The program introduced students to the ethos, structure, and expectations of international education, emphasizing the development of key IB learner profile attributes. Interactive sessions fostered open communication and critical thinking, promoting attributes like being Communicators and Thinkers. Students explored the structure and philosophy of the IB curriculum, including subject groups, core components (Theory of Knowledge, Creativity, Activity, Service, and the Extended Essay), and the importance of interdisciplinary learning. Sessions clarified assessment criteria, grading rubrics, and the distinction between formative and summative assessments, with emphasis on academic integrity and ethical use of information. Activities highlighted the significance of multilingualism and effective communication across disciplines, and students began developing personal learning portfolios, documenting language acquisition, creative writing, and reflective journaling. The course concluded with an introduction to the CAS program and the Theory of Knowledge course, providing students with a foundational understanding of these integral IB components. Overall, the bridge course effectively prepared students for the IGCSE and IB pathways by clarifying academic expectations and nurturing a learner-centered mindset aligned with international education standards.




# Fine Arts Stream IISians make a Mark at the Inter-School Mosaic 2025


His was a truly engaging session with a lot of take aways for the students.


## IIS World School at Sangam Super Jocks and Super Gals

IlSians visited the Anatomy Lab of the National Ayurveda Sansthan to gain practical insights into human anatomy, traditional Ayurvedic knowledge, and modern approaches to anatomical study. Students were shown preserved human organs and the skeletal system, live demonstrations on how anatomical knowledge supports diagnosis and treatment in Ayurveda, actual specimens, their structure and functions were harped upon. The lab used both digital and physical models to explain human anatomy. The importance of ethical handling of cadaveric material was emphasized. Students were overwhelmed on how ancient Indian medical science is still relevant today. The trip reinforced classroom topics and made the study of anatomy more engaging and meaningful.




## 10th Chapter IISMUN'25
