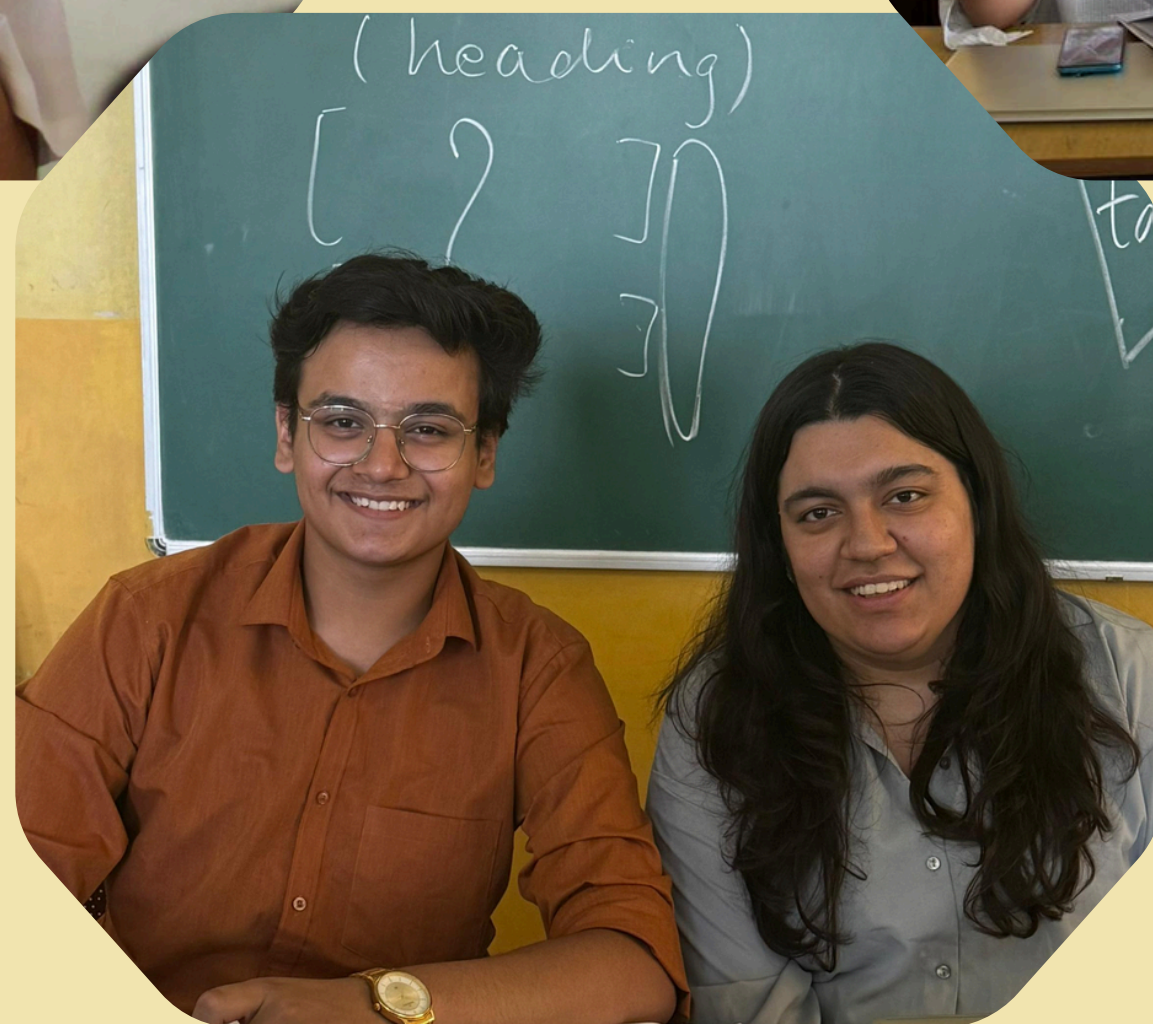
**Discussing the rise Ethno-Nationalism

**Addressing the challenges by transnational organised crime networks with emphasis on drug trafficking and smuggling operations**



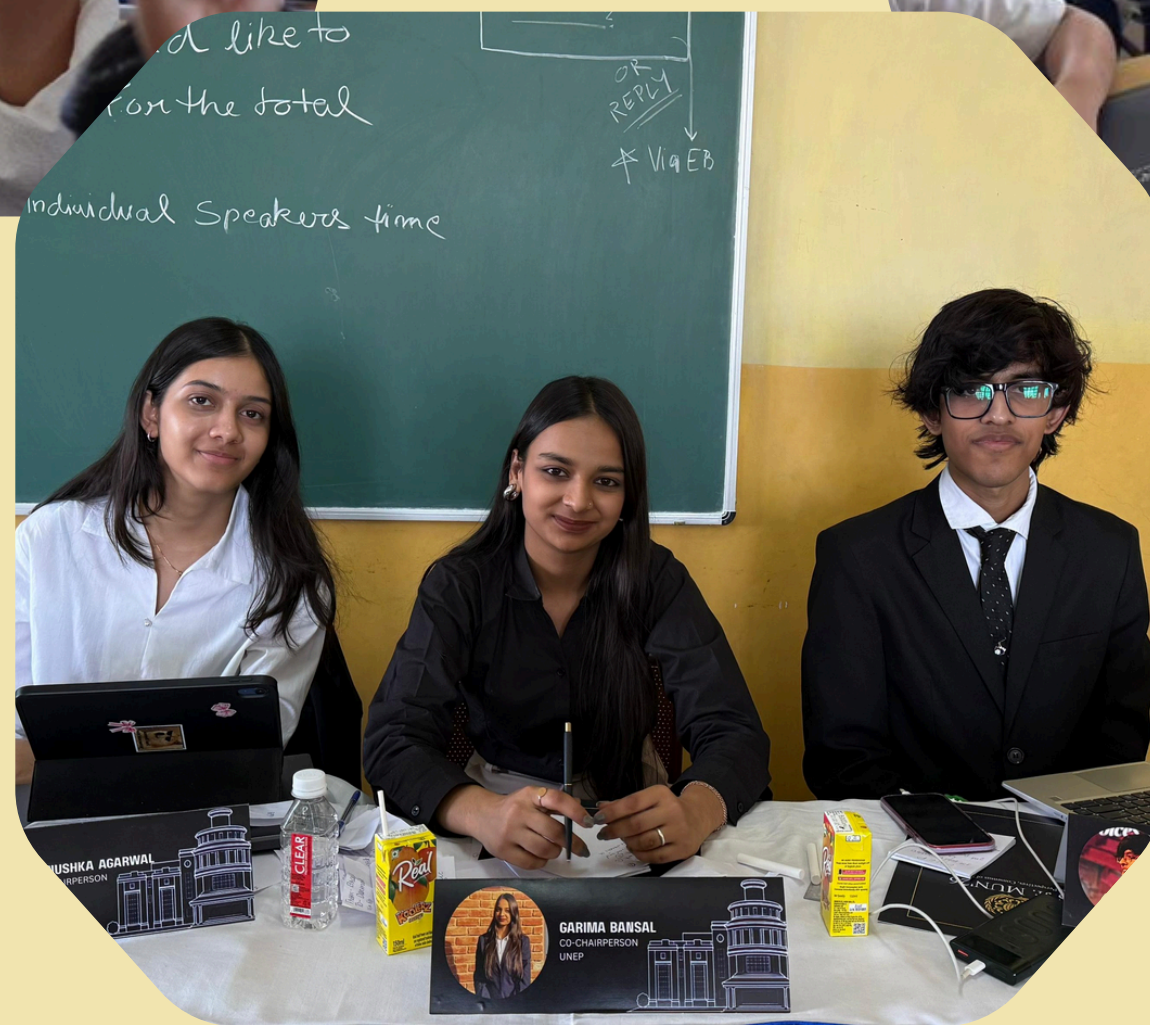
The UNODC committee confronted some of the darkest realities of the modern world with unflinching resolve and analytical depth.
