Rules & Protocols for Delegates

1. Delegates must address the Chair and fellow delegates with formal titles at all times – "Honorable Chair," "Distinguished Delegate" and "Esteemed Members of the committee" are to be used throughout proceedings.
2. All points and motions must be raised formally – including Points of Information, Points of Order, Points of Personal Privilege, and Motions to Open the Speakers' List.
3. Mobile phones must be kept on silent and are strictly prohibited during active committee sessions unless being used for research purposes.
4. Delegates must carry their placards, portfolio assignments, and delegate badges at all times within the conference premises.
5. No delegate may speak on the floor without being recognized by the Chair. Interruptions and unrecognized outbursts will result in a formal warning.
6. All working papers and draft resolutions must be submitted to the dais in the prescribed format and within the time limits specified by the Executive Board.
7. Delegates are expected to maintain decorum, respect, and diplomatic conduct at all times – personal attacks and disruptive behavior will not be tolerated.
8. The decision of the Secretariat with the Executive Board shall be final and binding in all matters of procedure and conduct.
9. Additionally, campus guidelines are to be followed at all times.
